Lenten Offering: The offerings received at the joint Lenten services will be designated for the synod assembly offering. This year's theme is "Seeds of Hope: Beyond All Imagination," and the offering has been designated for the ELCA Fund for Leaders to help future pastors attend seminary.

Council discusses plans for reserving niches in Columbarium and upcoming event dates

At their regular monthly meeting in January, council decided on a process for receiving monies for Columbarium niches, discussed digitalizing the Perpetual Care Records, and approved the purchase of two new offering plates. Vacation dates for Pastor Anne were approved for the year of 2018 and an update was given on the process for scheduling the pictures for pictorial directory coming up in February.

Pastor Anne informed council of the transfer out of membership of Mike Robinson to Abiding Presence in San Antonio, and the plans for Lenten services with Zion and St. Luke's. She proposed making first communion instruction available for first grade and up, with parents and pastor making decision on the readiness of the child to receive first communion, which council approved.

Easter youth activities and dates were discussed, upcoming Stewardship Emphasis will begin in February culminating on Commitment Sunday March 4, and report of property committee meeting with special guest speaker on church security was heard. A committee of David Bowman, Paul Post, Sandy Sanders, Ashford Taylor, and Terrell Wiggins was

an outcome of that meeting. They will bring recommendations to council for going forward with the security of St. Peter's buildings and people.



LWR project workdays share message of hope and great fellowship

Lutheran World Relief chair, Linda Dornburg, has called for a workday to complete the quilts for LWR and work with the boxing of the kits and quilts on February 13, at 10a.m. Please join us to make mission quilts (no sewing skills or WELCA membership required) for Lutheran World Relief and great fellowship. A lot of laughing, listening and loving each other happens as we tie knots and share a meal together. Pastor Anne is an active member of our group and it's an opportunity to interact with her outside the pulpit – her passion for this ministry is energizing. Linda will provide the “stone” for the soup and she invites everyone to join in, if they would like to bring ingredients for the soup or crackers, bread, desserts, or other items for the lunch.

The pews in the sanctuary will be draped with LWR quilts completed over the last year for the Spring Gathering on March 10 and will stay to be blessed during worship on March 11, prior to being sent across the globe. LWR describes these quilts as hugs that come from us to those who need it most, with a message of hope – that they aren't alone. What a wonderful way to serve and be fed in the Spirit! Collection of prayer shawls and pop tops continues

On March 10, 2018, St. Peter's Women of the ELCA will be hosting the 2018 Bluebonnet Spring Gathering. The completed shawls for the 2018 Synod Assembly will be collected at this event. There is still time for anyone that can knit or crochet to create prayer shawls to be gifted to voting members as they participate in the election process for the new bishop. As you create with yarn, pray for those making important decisions for the future of the church. You are welcome to knit or crochet, and use any pattern you are comfortable using. Shawls should be approximately 15 inches wide by 60 inches in length, depending on the style. Our goal is 400 shawls from across the synod. A box has been placed by the open closet in the narthex to receive the finished prayer shawls.

Collection containers for pull tabs from soda cans have been placed on the table by the open closet in the narthex. These pull tabs (or “pop tops”) are used by members of our companion synod in Costa Rica, Iglesia Luterana Costarricense, to make purses and other crafts to supplement their income. The Women of the ELCA will be taking the tabs to the Southwestern Texas Women's Convention that will be held on South Padre Island in September 2018.


