Summer trip to Splashway Waterpark

First 2018 Spark'd Summer Study held June 17

The first session of the Spark'd Summer Study for families was held on June 17. Families gathered to read the story "God Calls Samuel" from their Spark bible. Did you know that Samuel was only 12 years old when God called upon him? The kids were intrigued to learn that fun fact — especially since one of our participants was 12 years old too!

Following the story, children eagerly dashed with Ms. Sarah and Harley to the kitchen to create both a chocolate dream pie and an orange dream pie. The fluffy cool whip used in creating the pies reminded us of how Samuel may have thought he was dreaming when he heard his name being called in the night. While the pies set in the refrigerator, the youth were led by Ms. Jill and Ms. Jackie in creating colorful wind chimes. The noise from the chimes helps remind us to listen for the Holy Spirit. Like the wind, the Spirit moves through our lives all the time — we should be ready to say, "Here I am!"

We concluded our study session with a special song and memory verse led by Pastor Anne. Youth are encouraged to practice the memory verse throughout the summer — "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening!"

All are invited to the next session on July 15 when we study "David is Chosen".

Southwestern Texas Women of the ELCA 31st Annual Synodical Convention will be held September 28—30, 2018, at the Pearl Hotel, South Padre Island. Registration forms are on the bulletin board in the parish hall.

The Bible verse for the convention weekend is “Then He arose and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, “peace, be still” and the wind ceased and there was a great calm.”—Mark 4:39.

“Pop Tops and Flip Flops”—pop tops for the Women of Faith projects that help provide care for St. Johns, San Juan; flip flops for Saturday sunrise service on the beach.

Convention offerings will include monetary offering to go to La Posada Providencia Mission. La Posada Providencia, founded and sponsored by the Sisters of Divine Providence, is a ministry for people in crisis from around the world, who are seeking legal refuge in this country. The Shelter staff provides a safe and welcoming home; mentors to promote self-sufficiency and cultural integration; and imparts values which witness God’s Providence in our world. The physical offering, for La Posada, is asking for Walmart, Target, HEB, gas cards, etc. The Silent Auction will be divided 50% to Costa Rican Lutheran Church and 50% to Family Crisis Center, Inc. Family Crisis Center Mission works to assist victims and children in preventing and ultimately ending domestic violence and sexual assault in Northern Cameron and Willacy Counties.

In addition to the information under the pictures, they have the sound


system, the electrical system, and the air conditioning all in progress. The choir office cabinets and the external lanterns have arrived and are all in storage. The sanctuary is being reconfigured to create a better choir/congregation synergy. They are moving along.



Dear Friends and Faithful Supporters,

June 2018

This is my last newsletter to you, so it is fitting that I am writing it at the same time as the graduation ceremony of the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Hong Kong. In a sense, I am graduating along with our students as I leave Hong Kong after four years. In July I will head to San Miguel de Allende, Mexico, to become a student again myself in an intensive language course that will lead to a diploma in Spanish as a second language. This will enable me to do research for my next book, an exploration of the historical origins and theological significance of the Devil's place in Mexican Christmas traditions, focusing on the drama "La Pastorela," nativity scenes, and the original *piñata*, which represented the Devil's children, the seven deadly sins.

Epiphany season

As I look back over these four years to show you what your support has accomplished, I am dotting the newsletter with photos of the flowers that grace our chapel at LTS. They are brought up to the campus every Monday morning from Living Spirit Lutheran church at the bottom of the hill as part of its support for the work of the seminary. The floral arrangements are made by church members, and what artists they are!

My greatest pleasures during these years have been the interaction with students in the classroom and the close engagement with MTh and DTh students as they wrote their theses. These have been wonderful opportunities to watch students flourish and to know that they carry everything they have learned with them as they graduate and go out to further studies, to ministry in a congregation, to teaching or administering in a school, or to some kind of social service.

A typical classroom for me at LTS contained about eight students, sometimes each from a different country and often each in a different program. There were local Hong Kong students, mainland Chinese students, students from Myanmar, Malaysia, Indonesia, Cambodia, Nepal, Laos, South Africa, Switzerland, Finland, Germany, Scotland, and the U.S., in programs ranging from bachelor's to doctoral, along with non-degree students simply interested in the subject. The big turning point in the semester began at around week three, when the students got over their shyness to speak in English and entered into lively discussion with each other about our readings from a variety of perspectives. It was great fun to unleash the students' creativity and intellectual curiosity so that by the end of the semester they were able to present with competence the pieces of church history that had captivated them the most. One sat us down with him in third-century Alexandria, Egypt, to

experience a class on the Psalms with Origen; one impersonated a seventh-century Scottish girl encountering Christian missionaries in her village for the first time; one took us on a medieval pilgrimage with a digital map he made himself; with breathless excitement one introduced us to “The Stone”, the record of the earliest Christianity in China, tracking its discovery, its text, and recent scholarship on it; and one group led us in pondering why it was that Mechthild of Magdeburg was not burned at the stake like Marguerite Porete in spite of the similarities between them. Another highlight of these classes was the opportunity to make visits together. We experienced Coptic, Greek, and Russian Orthodox worship and met Muslim, Jewish, and Zoroastrian believers; and we grounded history in reality by going to the places where it happened. Of special significance was our trip to Macau to encounter the remnants of the sixteenth-century Catholic missions to Asia and the beginning of the nineteenth-century Protestant missions.

Of course, the deepest scholarly explorations in which I was privileged to participate were those of my MTh student, Rev. Ngui Au Sze, from Malaysia, and my DTh student, now Dr. Casthelia Kartika, from Indonesia. Au Sze wrote about the early leadership of women in the Basel Christian Church of Malaysia; and Casthelia studied the spirituality that Origen advocated, in which prayer was meant to shape one’s life into an embodiment of the scriptures, which themselves embodied Christ. Now both Au Sze and Casthelia are teaching church history at seminaries back home and Casthelia is also the president of her seminary. It is a proud and happy moment when one’s doctoral student graduates and becomes one’s colleague.

This is what you have accomplished by your support of our church’s global mission. The impact is felt in all these people, in all these ways, and in all these places. Many thanks to you and to God for the activity of the Holy Spirit in the church at all times and in all places (as we say in the Eucharistic liturgy each week). So, as the postscript says that I put at the bottom of each newsletter, you see how “your support makes a world of difference.” Although you can no longer support me, there are many others whom you can still support.
