

St. Peter's schedule for Lent, Holy Week, and Easter

*JOINT WEEKNIGHT LENTEN SERVICES with Martin Luther of Coletoville, St. Luke's of Schroeder, Zion of Arneckeville and St. Peter's of Ander continue through Holy Week as we focus on *Sounds of the Passion*. Each service begins at 7:30pm, and is preceded by a fellowship meal at 6:30pm.



- April 3 The Shouting of the Crowd, St. Peter's, Ander
- April 10 The Crowing of the Rooster, Martin Luther, Coletoville
- *LENTEN OFFERINGS RECEIVED, at the services shared by St. Peter's Lutheran Church of Ander, Zion Lutheran Church of Arneckeville, Martin Luther Lutheran Church of Coletoville, and St. Luke's Lutheran Church of Schroeder, will go to this year's synod assembly offering in support of the Tiemann endowment fund for leaders.
- *PALM SUNDAY/ SUNDAY OF THE PASSION 9am at St. Peter's. We will process in with palms, then the focus switches on the reason Jesus entered Jerusalem his suffering and death. The choir has prepared a special message, and we will hear the passion story from Luke as we begin this Holy Week.
- *THE MOVIE, *The Passion of the Christ*, will be shown in the fellowship hall on Sunday, April 14, at 3pm. Discussion and a potluck meal will follow. This is a wonderful way to help "set the mood" for Holy Week, but because it is so realistic, it is NOT recommended for children.
- *MAUNDY THURSDAY WORSHIP will be Thursday, April 18 at 7pm at St. Peter's Ander. There will be no meal before this service. Join us for this communion service as we remember Jesus' command to "Do this, in remembrance of me."
- *A GOOD FRIDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE will be held on Friday, April 19. We join together to remember Jesus' last hours of earthly life as he dies for our sins. The same service will be offered at **3pm** at Zion, Arneckeville and **7pm** (no meal) at St. Luke's, Schroeder.
- *EASTER SUNRISE SERVICE 7am at *The Gathering Place* (The picnic area). This devotional service welcomes the sunrise as we begin our celebration of the rising of God's Son.
- *EASTER FESTIVAL WORSHIP 9am in the sanctuary. Special music, special flowers, communion and more as we continue our resurrection celebration.

 Note: there will be no Sunday School classes on Easter Sunday.

*AN EASTER EGG HUNT,

sponsored by our youth, will be Saturday, April 20, beginning at 10am. Youth of all ages are invited to participate and do not have to be members of St. Peter's to join in the fun! We have lots of plastic eggs for hiding, but are still in need of confetti eggs and treats for the treat bags. Members of the congregation are invited to donate supplies if they'd like. A box has been placed in the narthex to collect all donations. We would like to have all donations collected by Sunday, April 14, so that goodie bags can be prepared that morning during the Sunday School hour. Parents and volunteers are welcome to assist in the assembly of goodie bags.

*AN EASTER BREAKFAST will be held, sponsored by our youth. Our youth and their families will be preparing the food, everyone else is invited to join us in the fellowship hall between the two Easter services to enjoy fellowship and good food.

St. Peter's February 28, 2019 Council Meeting in Brief

Council president, Eva Nell Griffith called the meeting to order.

Highlights of the Christian Education & Youth Ministry Committee (Brenda Bade):

- Fischer Saxton reported that the nursing home residents really enjoyed the Valentines.
- Pastor Anne has ordered Lenten materials for families.
- Easter egg hunt is April 20, 2019 at 10:00am. (No plastic eggs needed -Bring candy by April 14)
- Easter breakfast is April 21 following sunrise service.
- Camp work weekend at Ebert Ranch is April 26-28.
- Confirmation Sunday June 9, 2019.
- Youth Summer Camps: June 23-28 at Chrysalis and July 14-19 at Lutherhill.
- VBS (Toy Bible Stories) is June 20, 21 with closing on Sunday morning, June 23. Julie Frankie will set a planning meeting.

Sherry Sanders, Outreach Committee Chairman, reported that the two outdoor banners for St. Peter's have arrived. She noted that St. Peter's will participate in the 40 Cans for 40 Days with proceeds going to the Food Bank. Additionally, Sandra Post wrote a hymn with the "God's Work, Our Hands" theme. The hymn was submitted to the ELCA. St. Peter's choir will sing it on the "God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday. If the hymn wins, other churches in the ELCA may also be singing that hymn. Way to go, Sandra.

Council approved the purchase of another wireless head mic.

Spring Cleaning & Highway Trash Pick Up will be April 13, 2019.

hands make light work"! Ashford will also contact Don W. Reeves with 7580 Power Washing about the cost of cleaning mildew from the church roof. He will also contact someone about the handicapped ramp construction.

Terrell Wiggins, chair of safety/security, invited Alvin DeForest to present cost information on safety/security compliance renovations. Council approved a motion to recommend to the congregation the approval of funds not to exceed \$7,500 to cover costs for safety/security compliance renovations as presented in quotes. The congregational meeting is set for April 7, 2019. Additionally, council approved funding not to exceed \$500 to purchase emergency lights and fire extinguishers to comply with fire safety guidelines.

Council reviewed Stewardship & Finance activities of which Commitment Sunday and the Stewardship Stew will be March 3. Two line item expenses were accidentally omitted from the 2019 budget. Council voted to add to the 2019 Annual Budget, \$800 for accounting expenses and \$650 for advertising expenses.

Linda Koehler, Worship and Music Chair, shared the following as addressed by the committee.
