The theme this year will be *Sounds of the Passion*, focusing on some of the sounds heard during the passion of Christ. All services begin at 7:30pm and are preceded by a fellowship soup/sandwich meal at 6:30pm, for which the host congregation provides soup and those attending from other congregations will provide sandwiches, salads, and desert.

Outreach project announced for 40 days of Lent

40 CANS FOR 40 DAYS is the theme of our outreach project for Lent. Each member is asked to bring at least one item for the Goliad Food Pantry (canned or non-perishable items) for each of the 40 days of Lent – a small way of "giving up something for Lent" while helping our neighbors in need. You can bring the donations a week at a time, or bring all 40 at once ... you can even bring more than 40 if you want! All donations will be collected in the narthex and taken to the pantry weekly. Just think – if every one of our 195 members brought 40 items, that would be 7800 items to help stock the pantry shelves!!

St. Peter's January 24, 2019 Council Meeting in Brief

Newly elected council president, Eva Nell Griffith, presided over the January 24, 2019 meeting of St. Peter's council.

During Pastor Anne's report Council approved the following days for her 2019 vacation: April 23 – May 1, June 11-19, Sept. 10-25, and Dec. 26 - Jan. 2. Pastor also reported that Martin Luther in Colletoville voted to join Zion Lutheran in Arneckeville, St. Luke's in Schroeder and St. Peter's in Ander as a collaborative for the Wednesday night Lenten services. Additionally, Pastor noted that St. Peter's membership has increased to 195 members with 18 new members in 2018. Average church attendance is 72. All in all it's a great way to end 2018 and to begin 2019.

Highlights of the Christian Education & Youth Ministry report were:

- Fischer Saxton will work with the youths' "Valentines for Shut-Ins" project to satisfy a requirement for his LYLE Leadership Camp application.
- Pastor Anne will get Lenten education materials for families to use.
- St. Peter's "Easter Egg Hunt" is on April 20th at 10:00am. (NO plastic eggs needed this year). Members are asked to donate candy by April 14th.
- The youth group will serve the Easter breakfast following Easter sunrise service.
- June 9th was set for Confirmation.
- Youth summer camp dates are June 23-28 at Chrysalis and July 14-19 at Lutherhill.
- VBS is June 20, 21 and closing on Sunday morning the 23nd. Julie Franke will coordinate this event.
- Wendi Yendrey will serve as the 2019 Christmas program coordinator. Sherry Sanders, Outreach Committee chair, made several announcements. First, a new membership reception will be held for the Odem Family, Travis Post family and Paisley Post. Arlene DeForest and Wendi Yendrey will organize refreshments. Also, the next nursing home service is scheduled for March 10th. She was pleased to note that \$2,496.00 was sent to Paradise Lutheran Church in California. Sherry also mentioned a Lenten opportunity for families of St. Peter's to set a goal of 40 cans of food for 40 days. These canned goods would be taken to the local food pantry.

Ashford Taylor, chair of the Property Committee, sent a report noting that the sound system has been repaired. Additionally, Jerry Kolmeier repaired the toilet in the ladies restroom.

The formation of the Safety/Security Committee was approved. Terrell Wiggins serves as chair. Terrell has been consulting with Roy Boyd (Victoria Sheriff's Dept.) and the Goliad County Sheriff's Dept. He had Alonzo Morales, Goliad County Fire Chief inspect the buildings. His findings were that we needed doors with exit panic bars and lighted emergency exit signs in addition to fire extinguishers. Sandra Post agreed to serve as chair of a committee to develop the "Medical Emergency Policy". Sandra has enlisted the aid of Marilyn Morris and Allison Ball.

Trey Wimberly, chair of Stewardship and Finance, reported that the Stewardship Stew is set for March 3rd. The first temple talk for "Walk With Jesus" is set for February 10th and David Bowman will give that. Trey will get two more people to give the 2nd and 3rd temple talk. Pastor Anne will close with her sermon on Commitment Sunday, March 3rd. Trey also noted that the audit committee consists of Billy Dornburg, Chair, Bob Gerhardt and Loyce McCullough.
