

Reminders for needs of quilt and kit ministry


- Next Lutheran World Relief quilting workday will begin at 9am on September 18. We have a very good start with over 60 quilts completed at this time.
- Remember to bring any school kit items
 that you have purchased for Lutheran World
 Relief and place them in the box in the
 narthex. Most needed are the 70-sheet
 spiral notebooks, rulers and boxes of
 crayons (16 or 24). We will be completing
 the school kit project in September and
 then move the focus to collection of
 personal care items in October. Last year
 we donated a total of 138 School Kits to
 LWR. We received the following letter
 from Lutheran World Relief on
 August 9, 2019—

Dear Friends at St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Thank you for your generous gift of quilts and kits for LWR's distribution. These gifts of your hearts and hands are beautiful expressions of God's grace and love to people all around the world.

Because of your support LWR is able to share the tangible love of Christ with thousand of people through your quilts and kits. Last year, LWR and partners Children's Gift Ministry (CGM) and OLAM were busy distributing School Kits in Honduras, to children whose families are vulnerable due to lack of access to the most basic necessities. Parents often have to choose between feeding their children and sending them to school. School Kits were distributed to more than 28,000 Honduran children to help them get back to or stay in school, increasing their chances of breaking the chains of chronic poverty and avoiding the very real risk of gang involvement. In addition to being practical, these kits provide a source of comfort, security and hope to those who receive them.

Your quilts and kits provide important necessities to our neighbors around the world, and serve as reminders that they are not alone or forgotten. On behalf of our neighbors in villages, schools, hospitals and refugee camps around the world, I extend deepest thanks for you contribution, and pray God's richest blessing on your life and work!

St. Peter's guidelines for placing and removing people from the prayer list

Our Prayer List is an important ministry here at St. Peter's. Lately, there has been some confusion about how to get people on or off the prayer list.

The first step to getting someone on the list is to get their (or their family's) permission to be on a public prayer list. Once that is done, contact Pastor Anne by text, email, or phone call, and she will make sure the name gets added. The alternative to this is to put the request on the back of your weekly attendance card. If you put a name on the list, you or the person being prayed for are responsible for letting Pastor know when it is OK to take them off of the immediate prayer list, this will keep the phone contact to a minimum. Removal of a name from the prayer list can also be done on the back of the attendance card. We hope this clears up any confusion.
