YEA!!!!! SUNDAY SCHOOL ON-LINE SET TO BEGIN PLUS FACE-TO-FACE MONTHLY YOUTH ACTIVITIES.

St. Peter's youth, you can now tune into St. Peter's Sunday School on-line twice a month. The popular Whirl Sunday school lessons will be presented by volunteers every first and third Sunday of each month. The first lesson will be on October 4th and the second lesson is October 18th. Lessons will be in video format and student materials will be available to be printed. These lessons will be accessible via email and on line until face to face classes are possible again.

Additionally, Mrs. Leslie Wunsch will lead a Face To Face youth group activity each month. The October 18th youth group activity will be a scavenger hunt at The Gathering Place after worship service.

We are so excited to bring a form of normalcy back to St. Peter's Christian Education.

DRIVE IN WORSHIP IS BACK!

Starting in October, we will be worshiping at the Gathering Place "Drive in Style" at least twice a month. This means we can do more singing and have a little longer service. Dates scheduled for Drive in Worship so far are October 11 and 25 and November 8, 15 (Thankoffering) and 22. We are hoping that this will enable more people to come and participate in worship in person. All services will be recorded and posted online as usual.



Everyone is invited to St. Peter's Oktoberfest which will be held on Sunday, October 25th. This year **Habitat for Humanity—Goliad Build** will be the beneficiary of all proceeds.

The live auction will begin at 3:30pm at the Gathering Place and continue until around 5pm. Anyone who would like to help or has questions can contact Brenda Bade.

A bake sale will also be held at the Gathering Place during the time of the live auction. A separate area will have baked items for sale. Please bring items before 3:30pm on Sunday. Contact Linda Koehler if you have questions or would like to help.

A drive through meal will be served from St. Peter's parish hall beginning at 5pm and continuing until 6:30pm. The plate will include BBQ sausage with sauce, potato salad, noodles, green beans, sauerkraut and homemade bread. No meals will be severed or eaten in the parish hall. Each plate will be a \$10 minimal donation. If anyone would like to help prepare plates and or serve, please contact Jill Wiggins. Hope to see everyone there!

Church Council Highlights of the September 20, 2020 meeting

The council met on September 20 after worship. Highlights of that meeting (that aren't found in other articles in this newsletter) are listed below.

- Christian Education On-line Sunday School will be held twice a month starting October 4th & 18th. Youth group will meet in October with date to be determined. Confirmation classes started with 3 youth.
- Stewardship & Finance held their first 2021 budget planning meeting and will have one more meeting to finalize the 2021 Budget to be presented to council in October.
- Worship & Music recommended to council (and council agreed) to have 2 outside services a month at "The Gathering Place" starting in October.
- Council approved the 2019 distribution from the St. Peter's Mission Endowment Fund.
- Council approved Lutheran Disaster Response (USA disasters) as the designated recipient of the Christmas 2020 gifts.
- · Council approved opening the playground.
- Council approved Pastor Anne returning to the office to work. Pastor Anne's office hours are Tuesday mornings,
 Wednesday afternoons and Saturday mornings.

The next meeting will be October 18 after worship.

OKTOBERFEST LIVE AUCTION

Remember we are needing items for the Oktoberfest live auction on October 25th at 3:30p.m. at the Gathering Place. The proceeds will benefit Habitat for Humanity. Boxes for shipping are also needed at this time. Office paper boxes work well for packing school kits and personal care kits. Larger boxes are needed for quilts and baby kits.

Other on-going projects include "Quilts," where donated fabric and sheets are always needed and greatly appreciated. All of the Lutheran World Relief kit items listed on page 33 of the 2020 St. Peter's Yearbook.

PERSONAL CARE KIT SUPPLIES:

One light- to medium-weight, full-size bath towel Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap in original wrapping

One sturdy comb, remove packaging
One metal nail clippers (with or without attached file), remove packaging

Offerings given and not designated to a specific ministry or fund help support the following churchwide ministries:

- + Grow the ELCA in the United States (25%) begin and support new congregations, help existing congregations renew ministry, share resources
- + Grow the Lutheran Church (18%) support Lutheran World Federation, train mission leaders, support missionaries
- + Provide coordination and support for churchwide ministries (16%) keep records, provide churchwide office space, maintain archives, equip congregations and synods to assist in risk management and legal matters
- + Support and develop current and future leaders in the ELCA (15%) support seven seminaries and 26 colleges and universities, support a system of assignment for 9900 rostered ministers, offer leadership and opportunities for youth, provide resources and opportunities for networking lay leaders

- + Sustain ecumenical and interfaith relationships (2%)




Time and Talent commitment sheets
