# **COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS:**

CHURCH COUNCIL met on Sunday, September 18. Highlights of that meeting:

- \* It was decided to advertise in the Goliad, Yorktown and Cuero papers for someone to be our secretary. We will offer \$15 an hour for up to 15 hours a week, with the church number as first contact. David and Pastor will interview candidates.
  - \* December 11 was set as the date for the Annual Meeting Part 1 for elections of 2023 council, budget approval, and final vote on revised bylaws.
- \* December 4 has been set as the date for the Sunday School Christmas Program.
- \* It was approved to up the request for donations for plates at Oktoberfest from \$10 to \$12 a plate.
- \* Council approved a bid from Wendell Sandblasting to repaint the bell tower for \$4226.92.
- \* An audit committee has been appointed for this year's books:

Cody Foil, Shelby Torres and Ryan Luker

\* Not enough contributions were made to the Mission Endowment Fund this year to cover the distribution of the interest to charities, so we will need to dip into the fund. Council approved paying it from the ministry fund, with Mission Endowment fund paying it back.
