The Call Committee would like to give you all an update on the Call Process. We have completed the Ministry Site Profile, and it was submitted to the ELCA. We received information on a candidate that was interested in St. Peter's. We went through the interview process with this candidate and both the candidate, and the committee went through a discernment period. The candidate interviewed at other churches and ultimately selected another church. We prayed with this candidate to have an easy transition to the new church and for our church as we continue with this process.

It has been brought to our attention that other community members might know "more" than our church members do about the process. We can share certain happenings and information about the call process, but it must be at the right time and with approval from the Synod. We have just learned that the ELCA sends out an E-news newsletter. In the E-news, it shows St. Peter's is in the call process and is interviewing. This newsletter is sent out to churches and leaders that have a subscription to it. As with anything social media and email related, we cannot prevent people in the community from sharing news they see, nor adding to it. Please be patient and understanding with us as we follow the guidelines we are given.


